


THE WALK, MILES TO GO, THE ROAD TO GRACE, A STEP OF FAITH, WALKING ON WATER

"This series of books is about Alan Christoffersen and the story of his walk of approximately 3,500 miles across America from his home in Seattle, WA to Key West, FL. He takes this journey to "find hope". Alan's journey

begins after his world collapses and he loses his advertising business, his wife and his home. He takes the barest of essentials and leaves behind all he's known. He encounters many people along the way and they share many lessons with him. In book 4, (A Step of Faith) Alan has to stop his journey to Key West to attend another journey - taking care of his health. Again, he meets people that have lessons to teach Alan about love and accepting this love and to have faith that life is worth living and that he



can be forgiven. In the last book of this series, Alan faces yet another crisis that threatens to keep him from reaching his goal. With the help and support of a new friend and the reappearance of an old friend, Alan finds the determination to continue his journey to Key West and a new life. This series of books was amazing! It's amazing to me that someone could literally walk 3,500 miles alone, relying on the kindness of strangers along the way and having the faith to make this long, incredible journey across the country. An ending thought from book 5 (*Walking on Water*): In the end, it is not by knowledge that we make our journey, but by hope and faith - hope that our walk will be worthy of our steps and faith that we are going somewhere. And only when we come to the end of our journey do we truly understand that every step of the way we were walking on water."

"Beth O'Leary again delivers a romance full of feelings. The story features three women, strangers, who have one thing in common. Each one forgives him and lets him back in for a second chance, but are they just in for yet another heartbreak by a man with three women on the hook? Each woman featured had totally won me over in her first chapter, with complete personalities written in a



few short pages. Carter had me on tenterhooks the entire time - I really did not want to like him, but he kept winning me over, until the hurt from the woman I loved even more colored the edges of my vision again. It wasn't an emotional roller coaster ride, but something quieter and poignant, stronger in its restraint. 

### BOOKS ON WHEELS

ORLA's New Partnership with Area Elementary Schools

Last month, Youth Services Coordinator Annie Welsh loaded up 17 large bins of library books to be delivered to area Elementary Schools as part of a new program she created to make new and diverse titles more accessible to local students. She calls the program "Books on Wheels", which consists of a monthly delivery of over 500 hand-selected books to classrooms. The offerings in each bin range from picture books to chapter books, and materials will be different every month.

## "...TEACHERS CAN ONLY GET TO THE SCHOOL LIBRARY ON RARE OCCASIONS."

"There is no longer a school librarian at Smedley and Seventh Street Elementary Schools in Oil City. They have not purchased new books for their school libraries in at least five years, and teachers can only get to the school library on rare occasions. When they can go, it is up to the teacher to check out the books for students, adding more responsibility to already overworked teachers. The school libraries have been shuffled around and moved due to the need for more classroom space, making organization essentially absent", explained Youth Services Coordinator, Annie Welsh.

In order to expose the students to new and diverse titles, the Oil City Library is taking a direct approach to material distribution. Each month, between 30 and 40 books will be checked out to each classroom for student use, and delivered by our Youth Services Coordinator. Teachers will be able to choose books via our online catalog, or our Youth Services Coordinator will select a variety of appropriate age-level books for each classroom. Teachers will independently decide if they will send books home with the students or keep them in their classroom.




## "...ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT PREDICTORS OF GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL IS READING PROFICIENTLY BY THIRD GRADE."

Welsh highlighted the various benefits of the new program, "Access to these updated print materials will help encourage better literacy outcome for the students at these schools. According to The Reading Foundation, students are still learning to read through third grade, and beyond third grade they are *reading* to *learn*. The Reading Foundation also states that one of the most important predictors of graduating from high school is reading proficiently by third grade".

"Because of the limitations of their school libraries, many Oil City School District students no longer have easy access to new and popular titles to read. This pilot program will allow them access and exposure to a wider variety of books than they currently have. Allowing them access to more variety of titles will expand their reading choices and spark interest in different subjects. It will be easier for students to engage with the public library on their own time, as each child is eligible for a free library card and this will strengthen our partnership with the schools.

## "THE GOAL OF THE PROJECT IS TO REPLICATE THE PROGRAM ACROSS ALL VENANGO COUNTY SCHOOLS..."

"Parent information will be sent home periodically about the check out program, educating adults about what the library can offer to both the adults at home and the students. This project also eases the burden on teachers as there will be ready access to current and popular titles in their classroom for their students to read, freeing up the teachers' time. If the project at Smedley and Seventh Street is successful, and we are able to gain sufficient funding, the goal of the project is to replicate the program across all Venango County schools and see the benefits multiply."
