

### **HOW DOES SANTA GO DOWN THE CHIMNEY?**





We are closing out the year in Franklin at the Alsace Hotel. Better known as the Park Hotel, the original name came from the region of France Gen. Charles Miller was born in. The hotel opened in 1902, and the name changed to Park Hotel a few years later, reflecting its location across from Franklin's South Park. One of its most notable guests was Thomas Edison & his family. Fire broke out in the building in early 1944 and left the hotel so damaged, it was torn down shortly after.
