












BRIDE ****




MARGARETA MAGNUSSON

In Sweden, there is a kind of decluttering called döstädning, dö meaning "death" & städning meaning "cleaning." This surprising and invigorating process of clearing out unnecessary belongings can be undertaken at any age or life stage, but should be done sooner rather than later, before others have to do it for you. In The Gentle Art of Swedish Death Cleaning, artist Margareta Magnusson, with Scandinavian humor & wisdom, instructs readers to embrace minimalism. Her radical & joyous method for putting things in order helps families broach sensitive conversations & makes the process uplifting rather than overwhelming. Margareta suggests which possessions you can easily get rid of (unworn clothes, unwanted presents, more plates than you'd ever use) & which you might want to keep (photographs, love



letters, a few of your children's art projects). Digging into her late husband's tool shed & her own secret drawer of vices, Margareta introduces an element of fun to a potentially daunting task. Along the way, readers get a glimpse into her life in Sweden, & also become more comfortable with the idea of letting go.

"The book is fine. No real new information about decluttering. It states how you should only keep items that have immediate use or serious sentimental value & not to expect your family to have the same ideas of importance that you do about your stuff. Honestly, I think Marie Kondo's book states the same ideas more clearly & has better exercises to go through your stuff, even if they feel a bit silly sometimes. The book also functions okay as a memoir of sorts. The author includes a lot of personal information in her advice. I can see how that could be a draw, but if you're just looking for advice for decluttering, it makes the book a longer read for no reason. Not my favorite I've read this year, sadly." EMPIRE OF AI ***

KAREN HAO

When AI journalist Karen Hao first began covering OpenAI in 2019, she believed they were the good guys—a nonprofit founded to prioritize safety over profit. But as she dug deeper, Hao uncovered the staggering resources fueling Al's rise: vast computing power, massive datasets cleaned by underpaid workers in the Global South, & immense energy & water consumption. The field had become a new kind of empire, dominated by a few global giants. After partnering with Microsoft, OpenAl's rapid growth raised questions about whether it could resist the same temptations it once vowed to check. Hao's inside access offered an intimate view of the chaos surrounding Sam Altman's shocking firing &

swift reinstatement, revealing much about the power structures driving the industry. Drawing on voices from Silicon Valley to Kenya and Chile, Hao exposes the human and environmental costs of Al's expansion. Empire of Al offers a penetrating look at how naked ambition, cloaked in good intentions, is reshaping our world.

Setting a Sleep Timer

While Libby's sleep timer is most often used to drift off to an audiobook at night, it can also be a surprisingly effective tool for managing your time during the day. The feature allows listeners to set a specific duration before playback automatically stops -perfect for anyone who wants to keep their listening (and their to-do list) on track.

Try using the sleep timer to structure daily routines or errands. For instance, set a 30minute timer for cleaning a room or tackling a household project, or choose an hour for a round of errands like visiting the post office, gas station, or grocery store. When the audiobook stops, it's an easy cue to wrap up what you're doing or take a quick

Using audiobooks as a timekeeper can make even mundane tasks more enjoyable. Pairing stories or learning with everyday activities not only helps the time pass quickly but also turns ordinary moments into productive, engaging experiences.




