MONSTRILIO ★★★★☆

GERARDO SÁMANO CÓRDOVA

Grieving mother Magos cuts out a piece of her deceased eleven-year-old son Santiago's lung. Acting on fierce maternal instinct and the dubious logic of an old folktale, she nurtures the lung until it gains sentience, growing into the carnivorous little Monstrilio she keeps

hidden within the walls of her family's decaying Mexico City estate. Eventually, Monstrilio begins to resemble the Santiago he once was, but his innate impulses--though curbed by his biological and chosen family's communal care--threaten to destroy this fragile second chance at life.

"I'm so conflicted about this book. The first part is an amazing look at a mother's desperation at the fact of losing her child to disease & the insanity that grief can cause. 5-star character study. The rest is a mediocre monster novel. It feels like an entirely different & heavy-handed book about the queer experience, both in metaphor with the 'monster' & spelled out with

some of the other characters. Please make no mistake, I enjoy a book with a diverse cast. It just feels so one-dimensional and uninteresting, especially when compared to the writing in the first section. I would like to cut out the first part & have it be a novella. EMILIA HART




2019: Lucy awakens from a dream to find her hands around her ex-lover's throat. Horrified, she flees to her older sister's house on the Australian coast, hoping she can help explain the strangely vivid nightmare that preceded the attack - but Jess is nowhere to be found. As Lucy awaits her return, the rumors surrounding Jess's strange small town start to emerge. Numerous men have gone missing at sea, spread over decades. A tiny baby was found hidden in a cave. And sailors tell of hearing women's voices on the waves. Desperate for answers, Lucy finds and begins to read her sister's adolescent diary. 1999: Jess is a lonely 16-year-old in a rural town in the middle of the continent. Diagnosed with a rare allergy to water, she has always felt different, until her young, charming art teacher takes an interest in her drawings, seeing a power and maturity in them - and in her - that no one else has. 1800: Twin sisters Mary and Eliza have been torn from their loving father in Ireland and forced onto a convict ship bound for Australia. For their entire lives, they've feared the ocean, as their mother tragically drowned when they were just girls. Yet as the boat bears them further & further from all they know, they begin to notice changes in their bodies that they can't explain, & they feel the sea beginning to call to them... A breathtaking tale of female resilience & the bonds of sisterhood across time & space, *The Sirens* captures the power of dreams & the mystery and magic of the sea.

"I love mythology and will read any book with this theme. Hart wrote of sirens different from the Greek ones I know best, but that's not to say I liked them any less. I think these sirens were inspired by Irish folklore, where the Merrow is their closest match. I must say, I didn't see the twist in this book coming, and by the end, I was surprised I hadn't seen it coming. East Long Beach. The LAPD is barely keeping up with the neighborhood's high crime rate. Murders go unsolved, lost children unrecovered. But someone from the neighborhood has taken it upon himself to help solve the cases the police can't or won't touch. They call him IQ. He's a loner and a high school dropout, his unassuming nature disguising a relentless determination and a fierce intelligence. He charges his clients whatever they can afford, which might be a set of tires or a homemade casserole. To get by, he's forced to take on clients who can pay. This time, it's a rap mogul whose life is in danger. As Isaiah investigates, he encounters a vengeful ex-wife, a crew of notorious cutthroats, a monstrous attack dog, and a hit man who even other hit men say is a lunatic. The deeper Isaiah digs, the more far-reaching and dangerous the case becomes.

"I'm not sure why I put this book on my list; the blurb isn't really what I normally would choose. However...it's the awesome narrator that kept me listening, and I'm glad I did. The main character is so calm, he's accepted his life. He's crazy observant, and he's able to connect clues that the police overlook. This talent puts him in some interesting situations. Bunco is a dice game generally played with twelve or more players, divided into groups of four, trying to score points while taking turns rolling three dice in a series of six rounds. A bunco is achieved when a person rolls three-of-a-kind and all three numbers match the round number.




- Log in with your library card number & start reading!





ORLA Ceases Operations at Cooperstown Public Library

It is with heavy hearts & great disappointment that we announce the closure of our ORLA branch in Cooperstown beginning January 2026. Residents who utilize this outlet are encouraged to maintain their access to our libraries at the locations in Oil City & Franklin, or through our robust digital collection.

It's important to know that this decision did not come lightly & was never the intention of ORLA. Unfortunately, our efforts to seek dedicated countywide support in the recent election failed to pass. Ongoing fundraising campaigns over the years have also been unable to raise sustainable-level funding to adequately fund the Cooperstown location. Therefore, we are consolidating our efforts further to provide the best level of library services we can promise and that the community expects. Thank you for your understanding & support.




