

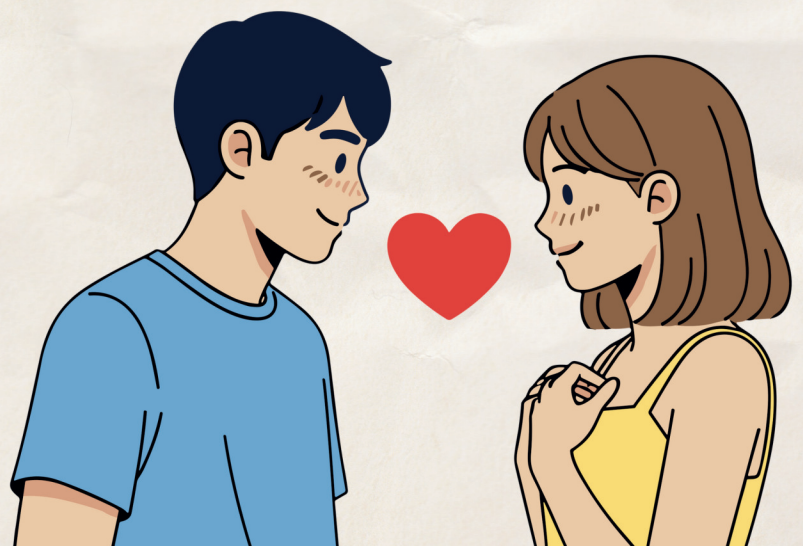

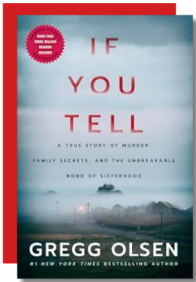

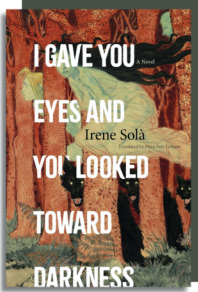

After more than a decade, when sisters Nikki, Sami, & Tori Knotek hear the word mom, it claws like an eagle's talons, triggering memories that have been their secret since childhood. Until now. For years, behind the closed doors of their farmhouse in Raymond, WA, their sadistic mother, Shelly, subjected her girls to unimaginable abuse, degradation, torture, & psychic terrors. Through it all, Nikki, Sami, & Tori developed a defiant bond that made them far less vulnerable than Shelly imagined. Even as others were drawn into their mother's dark & perverse web, the sisters found the strength & courage to escape an escalating nightmare that culminated in multiple murders. Harrowing & heartrending, *If You Tell* is a survivor's story of absolute evil - and the freedom & justice that Nikki, Sami, & Tori risked their lives to fight for. Sisters forever, victims no more, they found a light in the darkness that made them the resilient women they are today - loving, loved, & moving on.

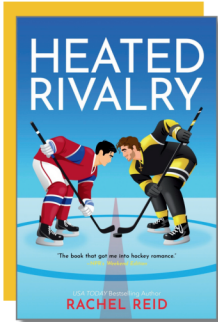
★★★★★ I GAVE YOU EYES AND YOU LOOKED TOWARD DARKNESS

Dawn is breaking over the Guillerries, a rugged mountain range in Catalonia frequented by wolf hunters, brigands, deserters, race-car drivers, ghosts, & demons. In a remote farmhouse called Mas Clavell, an impossibly old woman lies on her deathbed. Family & caretakers drift in and out. Meanwhile, all the women who have lived & died in that house are waiting for her to join them. They are preparing to throw her a party. As day turns to night, 400 years' worth of stories unspool, & the house reverberates with raucous laughter, pungent feasts, & piercing cries of pleasure & pain. It all begins with Joana, Mas Clavell's matriarch, who once longed for a husband - "a full man," perhaps even "an heir with a patch of land & a roof over his head." She summoned the devil to fulfill her wish & struck a deal: a man in exchange for her soul. But when, on her wedding day, Joana discovered that her husband was missing a toe (eaten by wolves), she exploited a loophole in her agreement, heedless of what consequences might follow.

“I love family epics. I love novels that follow a group of people through time & tell stories about their lives, how they intertwine, & how the world changes around them & affects them. This is a pretty good one! Solà weaves the past & present, the living & the dead, myth & history all together to make a collective whole that is beautiful & enjoyable to read. It can be challenging to keep track of characters because she jumps between the past and the present with little warning, but I always found myself able to get back on track fairly easily. Pro hockey star Shane Hollander isn't just crazy talented; he's got a spotless reputation. Hockey is his life. Now that he's captain of the Montreal Voyageurs, he won't let anything jeopardize that, especially the sexy Russian whose hard body keeps him awake at night. Boston Bears captain Ilya Rozanov is everything Shane's not. The self-proclaimed king of the ice, he's as cocky as he is talented. No one can beat him—except Shane. They've made a career on their legendary rivalry, but when the skates come off, the heat between them is undeniable. This month we're looking at Coefield's Corners in Franklin. Back in 1919, Frank H. Williams became owner of Franklin's second authorized Ford agency. The first belonged to his partner and former boss, Frank E. Steele. The cement block with planter on top, which stood on this corner for many years, is a familiar sight to some. This location was later home to Buyer's Fair, and now houses Hand in Hand Christian Counseling.

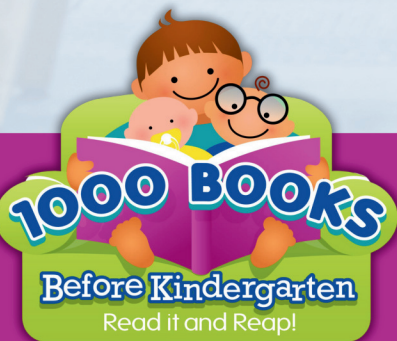
How it works:

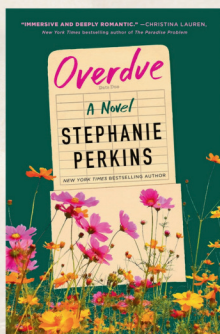
## Story of My Life Lucy Score

A big-hearted small-town romance featuring sharp banter, slow-burn chemistry, & two stubborn souls learning that love might just rewrite everything they thought they knew.



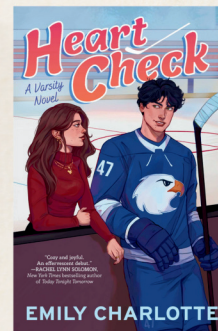
## The Ten Year Affair Erin Somers

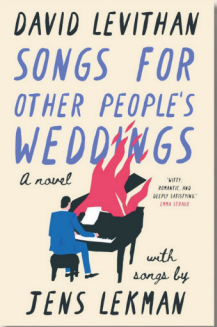




## Atmosphere

B.K. Borison

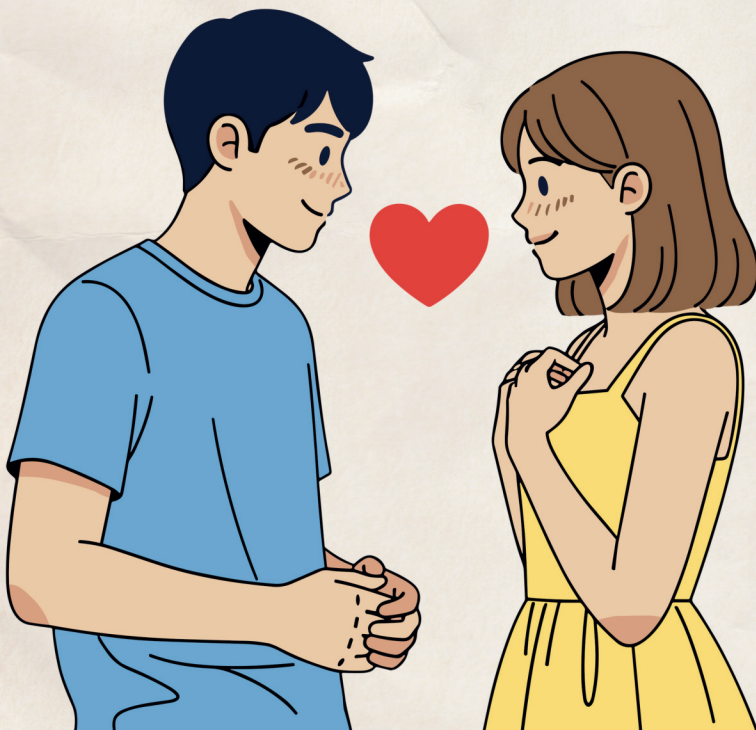

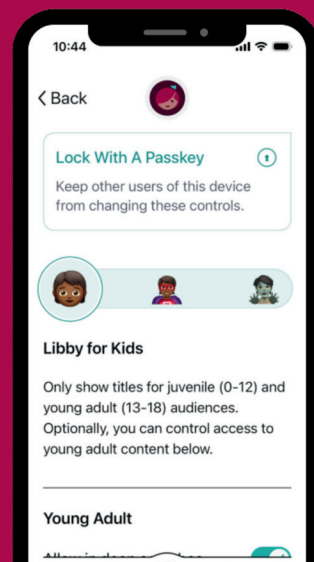

## Using Content Controls

Content controls serve multiple purposes in Libby. **Libby for Kids** hides everything that isn't juvenile or young adult content and can be further refined. You can also lock content control settings with a passkey (including one on another device) to make these settings more secure.

A less well-known use for content controls is customizing your browsing experience. **Libby for Everyone** doesn't hide anything by default, but you can hide mature content if that's not something you're interested in. You can also use **Libby for Grown-ups** to hide kids titles and streamline your browsing and searching in Libby.

Content controls work like app-wide filters that you can use to customize your experience. If you haven't tried them yet, they're worth experimenting with!

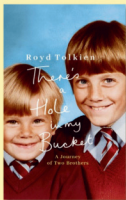

This year, 20 total teams competed to finish a 1000-piece jigsaw puzzle within the 4-hour time limit.

Team "3 Daughters & a Mom" were the 1st place winners of the Puzzle Challenge, finishing their 1000-piece puzzle in just 1 hour, 41 minutes & 51 seconds! "The Panicking Puzzlers" were the 2nd place winners, finishing their puzzle in 1 hour, 42 minutes & 15 seconds! Team "Livin' on the Edge Pieces" took 3rd place, finishing in 1 hour, 44 minutes and 7 seconds.

The top 3 placers finished within minutes of each other. 16 total teams finished their puzzles, while 4 teams attempted, but did not finish.


